

Located in the cliffs and canyons of the Santa Monica Mountains, Topanga State Park features 36 miles of trails through open grassland, live oaks and spectacular views of the Pacific Ocean. The park is located entirely within the Los Angeles city limits and is considered the world's largest wild land within the boundaries of a major city. Excellent recreational opportunities for hikers as well as mountain bikers (restricted to fire roads) and equestrians. The park is bound on the south by Pacific Palisades and Brentwood, on the west by Topanga Canyon, and on the east by Rustic Canyon. Numerous geologic formations can be found in the park, including earthquake faults, marine fossils, volcanic intrusions, and a wide variety of sedimentary formations. On Sunday Oct 25 VAG will host its first ever Autumn season paint out. We encourage all members of all experience levels to join us. We will also have the pleasure of enjoying the company of Plein Air artist Eric Merrel. Eric will be working along side us in this first ever fall event. I highly recommend you not to miss this incredible opportunity and learning experience.



Behind The Easel



Eric Merrell was born in Gilroy, California on April 24, 1978 and raised there and in Rochester, New York. Early studies in watercolor with Diane Wallace in the Gilroy area exposed him to outdoor painting, which were followed by figure and portrait painting classes in oils with Jim Smyth at the Pacific Art League of Palo Alto, California. Moving back to the east coast after high school, Eric took classes with Al Gury at The University of the Arts and The Pennsylvania Academy of Fine Arts, both in Philadelphia. After spending two years in the city, he moved back to California, transferring to Art Center College of Design in Pasadena. For a time during school Eric worked at the Norton Simon Museum, where the long hours offered plenty of time to study and sketch from the collections. He also worked for the California Art Club, researching archival material and at one point interviewing Evelyn Payne Hatcher, the daughter of Edgar and Elsie Payne, early CAC members. Graduating from Art Center in 2001 and receiving a BFA with honors, Eric continued to study painting with artists Peter Adams, Stephen Mirich and Daniel W. Pinkham.



Eric's adventures have included many trips around California, throughout the Sierras and the deserts, along the Pacific Coast, and a solo cross-country painting trip to Philadelphia and back. In late 2002 he traveled to France and painted in the countrysides and cities of Lyon, Chamonix and Dijon, among many others. In April of 2004 he was invited to stay at the Old Battersea House in London and paint in England along with ten other young artists; his paintings were featured in a subsequent exhibition held at the Forbes Gallery in New York City in January 2005. Eric was one of six artists from around the world selected for the Joshua Tree Highlands Artist Residency during July and August 2009.

Eric has appeared in publications such as *American Art Collector*, *Southwest Art* and *American Artist*; his work has been exhibited at the Cape Cod Museum of Art in Orleans, MA; the Long Beach Museum of Art in Long Beach, CA; the Pasadena Museum of California Art in Pasadena, CA; and the Frederick R. Weisman Museum at Pepperdine University in Malibu, CA.

Currently, Eric is teaching landscape painting independently and at the Los Angeles Academy of Figurative Art in Van Nuys, California.

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
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
Coming in November
